

General: Camping has been a part of Run for the Wall from the very beginning. In the beginning, riders would often tie a tarp off to their motorcycle and throw a bedroll underneath! Although most riders choose the convenience of motels on the ride, the cost can be prohibitive for some riders. Most camping locations along the route are free or donated, which can make the cost of a 10 day ride more easily achievable. It is desirable to do some motorcycle camping BEFORE trying to do this on RFTW. Sleep is important to maintaining individual endurance during this 10 day ride, and campers should do the utmost to get as much sleep as possible! Reconnoiter the campgrounds on Google Map or Google Earth before you leave home and print out your own maps using the addresses provided for each location.

Weather: It usually rains (or snows) somewhere along the route. Some camping locations have inside space to get out of the weather. But make sure your tent is watertight. Plan on setting up and taking down in rainy weather. Have a Plan B to find a motel or share a room if the weather gets really bad!

Packing: Think backpacking. Keep everything small and light. If carrying on the bike, use a small 1 or 2 man tent and lightweight groundcloth, lightweight sleeping bag (suitable for various temperatures) and an air mattress for comfort. Keep clothing to a minimum or plan to do laundry along the way (which cuts into sleeping time). Trailers pulled behind the motorcycle can make packing a lot easier and quicker than lashing everything down to a motorcycle.

Time: Plan on additional time in the morning to take down and pack your gear. Getting up and getting ready to go will NOT be done leisurely while sipping your morning coffee! An additional 45 minutes or so may be required after wakeup to make it to the morning rally point. Also... most of the camping is located some distance from the morning rally point, so take that into consideration. Gas up the night before so that you don't need time to find a gas station. Practice setting up and taking down (and time yourself) in advance.

Electrical Power: Cellphones, Sena headsets, GMRS Radios and GPS' all usually need to be charged each night. Some campgrounds have outlets available and these are noted by location. An extension cord / multitap comes in handy sometimes. Plan on bringing a backup power supply for those locations that don't have power.

Toilet Facilities: All of the campgrounds have some sort of toilet facilities available, but some locations will have porta potties. Always best to carry your own TP in a Ziploc bag in your saddlebag on the Run, anyway!

- Website is somewhat difficult to navigate. Hit the red “Reserve Now” button to access the reservation system. Then hit the tan colored “Go Camping” at the top of the page. Then on the left side of the page, select “Prado Regional Park”. Then input the dates and hit “Show Available Sites”. Note that dates are ARRIVAL and DEPARTURE.
- Not all of the campsites allow tents due to irrigation system. I camped at Site 30 (which is already booked for 2026) because it was closest to the toilets and showers and allowed tents.
- There is a locking gate and you will need to get gate code from the Park Office. Get there before closing at 5P!

Pros: Quiet and remote. Large campsites with tables

Cons: Somewhat long ride from campground to host hotel through some interesting locales (you will swear you are lost). Not a lot of choices for food in the area, use Google Maps to find restaurants.
